

Council Meeting- May 19, 2016

Mayor Thomas L. Hardesty called the regular council meeting to order with the following council members present: Bobby Andriot, Mike Zoeller, Donna Eaton, Shane Suttor, Jon Swindler and Frank Page.

City employees present: Jennifer Herrell, Inez Harris, Kevin Baker and Fred Rogers.

All present pledged allegiance to the flag.

Minutes Regular May 6, 2016

Councilmember Page moved to approve the minutes of the May 6, 2016 council meeting as read by council members prior to the meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Swindler.

All voted “aye” and the motion carried.

Presentation-Proposed change to the Zoning Regulations in the Ag/Commercial District- Dave Hamlin

Dave Hamlin was the spokesman for a committee of people looking for a safe place for sober living. They are looking for property in areas not zoned residential. They have identified two properties that would fit the needs of the group.

The properties are 703 Third Street and 701 Washington Street. The plan would be to make the Third Street property into a job training center and the Washington Street property into a 1st stage shelter for women.

Mr. Hamlin is asking for a conditional use change in the Limited Historic District and Ag/Commercial District allowing for transitional use.

Mr. Gregory will prepare a resolution to send to zoning.

Ordinance No. 2016-05-19/Adopting the City of Shelbyville Annual Budget for the Fiscal Year July 1, 2016 thru June 30, 2017 - 2nd Reading-Inez Harris, City Clerk

Ms. Harris, City Clerk, read the summary of the ordinance adopting the estimating revenues and resources, and appropriating funds for the operation of city government for the City of Shelbyville for the fiscal year July 1, 2016 thru June 30, 2017.

It was introduced for second reading by Councilmember Zoeller. Seconded by Councilmember Page.

Ordinance/Updating the Position Description of Mechanic-1st Reading- Steven Gregory

Steven Gregory, City Attorney, read an ordinance of the City of Shelbyville updating the position description of mechanic. This ordinance amends No. 93-02-18.

It was introduced for first reading by Councilmember Zoeller. Seconded by Councilmember Swindler.

Proclamation-Historic Presentation Month

This year marks the 50th anniversary of the National Preservation Act which established federal historic preservation policy. The Kentucky Heritage Council/State Historic Preservation is responsible for identifying, protecting and preserving historic and cultural resources throughout the Commonwealth. The City of Shelbyville has been a certified local government since 1986 and has established historic preservation as a public policy and observes May 19th as Historic Preservation Month.

Certificate of Excellence Awards-Fred Rogers

Fred Rogers, City Administrator, and Sherry Jelsma, Chair of the Historic District Commission, awarded two Certificate of Excellence Awards to Bobby and Sue Andriot for restoring their home at 721B Main Street, and to Charles Long and Kerry Magan (representatives of Shelbyville Preservation Group) for restoring the Blue Gables.

Proclamation – Building Safety Month

Mayor Hardesty declared May 2016 as Building Safety Month which is sponsored by the International Code Council.

Approval of the 2016-2017 Salt Bids-Jennifer Herrell

Mrs. Jennifer Herrell, Public Works Superintendent, reported the City of Shelbyville participated in the reverse auction of salt bids sponsored by KLC and KACO. The lowest price received for salt was \$64.40 per ton from Cargill. The lowest price received last year was \$74.00 per ton. Mrs. Herrell recommends Cargill be awarded the salt bid for 2016 in the amount of \$64.40 for 425 tons for a total of \$27,370.00 to be delivered after July 1.

Councilmember Eaton moved to approve the recommendation. Seconded by Councilmember Zoeller.

All voted “aye” and motion carried.

Annual Compliance MS4 Stormwater Report-Jennifer Herrell

Jennifer Herrell, Public Works Superintendent/City Engineer, made her annual report to the council pertaining to the MS4 Stormwater Program. This program consists of 6 small programs. They are: Public Education and Outreach, Public Participation, Illicit Discharge, Detection and Elimination, Construction Site Stormwater Runoff, Post Construction Stormwater Management,

and Municipal Operations Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping. The City of Shelbyville has committed \$35,000 of the city's annual budget to MS4 Stormwater compliance. We have collected 42.56 miles of stormwater mapping and installed a new salt bin at public works at a cost of \$120,000. We hold annually the Household Hazard Waste Project where we collected 35,033 pounds of waste at a cost of \$24,000. In this year's budget we also included \$30,000 to the Stormwater Master Plan. We are holding our own and are above some communities on the stormwater curve.

Public Comments

Charles Long and Kerry Magan, representatives of Shelbyville Preservation Group, gave an update on the Blue Gables Project. It is almost finished. Concrete needs to be poured along with flooring and plumbing going in. They will begin to market the buildings.

Department Reports

Candice Selph, Human Resources Director, reported that Fred Rogers has been promoted to City Administrator. Shannon Darst has been hired as the Mayor's Administrative Assistant. She and Mary Smith attended a conference in Bowling Green Kentucky.

Fire Chief Kevin Baker reported the department just finished the Rope/High Angle Rescue Class. There will be a new recruit class starting in August.

Steven Gregory, City Attorney, reported the work on the telecommunication franchise ordinance is coming. A survey was sent out and he is receiving written comments from companies.

Mayor's Report

Mayor Hardesty received a call from Greg Butler at Republic Services wanted him to caution citizens to carefully watch what is being recycled. Goodyear will have a re-opening on May 20th. The Health Department will have a Fun Fest on May 22nd. Project Graduation is at Collins this year on May 28, 2016. City Hall will be closed for the Memorial Day Holiday on Monday, May 30, 2016.

Councilmember Zoeller moved to adjourn at 7:40 PM. Seconded by Councilmember Swindler.
