

Council Meeting – June 2, 2016

Mayor Thomas L. Hardesty called the regular meeting to order with the following council members present: Bobby Andriot, Mike Zoeller, Donna Eaton, Shane Suttor, Jon Swindler, and Frank Page.

City employees present: Mary Smith, Barry Ethington, Inez Harris, Jennifer Herrell, Doug Herndon, and Fred Rogers.

City Attorney: Steven Gregory

Invocation: Dave Hamlin, Shelby Christian Church

All present pledged allegiance to the flag.

Public Hearing Minutes 5/19/2016 and Regular Minutes 5/19/2016

Councilmember Page moved to approve the minutes of the Public Hearing of May 19, 2016 and the regular minutes of May 19, 2016 as read by the councilmembers prior to the meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Zoeller.

All voted “aye” and the motion carried.

Discussion - Proposed Change to the Zoning Regulation to the Limited Historic District

Dave Hamlin, concerned citizen stressed this is a community project working with other agencies in the community. There are other offers on the 701 Washington building, but the owner, Leslie McCarty, is working with the group to help make this project a reality. This plan will be done in steps. There is a 10 year plan. It will be a low level detox facility with a high level of accountability. At this point, the 3rd Street property is not on the table. We are looking for a conditional use permit for this project.

Councilmember Swindler made a motion to move forward with a resolution to ask zoning for a conditional use permit for 701 Washington Street. Seconded by Councilmember Page.

All voted “aye” and the motion carried.

Ordinance/Enacting Text Amendments to the Article III of the Shelbyville Zoning Regulation – 1st Reading, Steven Gregory

Steven Gregory, City Attorney, read an ordinance of the City of Shelbyville amending Section 300, whereas; the Administration Official shall have the authority to enforce and administer zoning enforcement. There was also other areas cleaned up in other sections in Article III.

It was introduced for first reading by Councilmember Suttor. Seconded by Councilmember Swindler.

Ordinance No. 2016-06-02/ An Ordinance of the City of Shelbyville Updating the Position of Mechanic – 2nd Reading, Steven Gregory

Steven Gregory, City Attorney, read the summary of an ordinance of the City of Shelbyville updating the position description of mechanic. This position performs skilled, mechanical, preventative, and repair work to city owned vehicles along with other duties related to the Public Works Department.

It was introduced for second reading by Councilmember Swindler. Seconded by Councilmember Page.

Upon roll call the following councilmembers voted “aye”: Andriot, Zoeller, Eaton, Suttor, Swindler, and Page.

Resolution – 2016-06-02/Authorizing Mayor Hardesty to Enter into an Agreement with the Kentucky Office of Homeland Security.

Councilmember Page moved to authorize Mayor Hardesty to enter into an agreement with the Kentucky Office of Homeland Security to execute documents to secure funds for the Fire Department to purchase hand held radios. This grant will pay about 90% with the department paying 10%. The estimated cost is \$17, 000. Seconded by Councilmember Eaton.

All voted “aye” and the motion carried.

Appointment- Randy Fawns to the Code Enforcement Board to Complete the Unexpired Term of Steve Ladden to June 30, 2017

Mayor Hardesty recommended Randy Fawns be appointed to the Code Enforcement Board to complete the unexpired term of Steve Ladden to the Code Enforcement Board to June 30, 2017.

Councilmember Swindler moved to approve the appointment. Seconded by Councilmember Eaton.

All voted “aye” and the motion carried.

Re-appointment – Nathan Riggs to the Code Enforcement Board to June 30, 2019 – Mayor Hardesty

Mayor Hardesty recommended Nathan Riggs be re-appointed to the Code Enforcement Board to expire June 30, 2019

Councilmember Eaton moved to approve the re-appointment. Seconded by Councilmember Suttor.

All voted “aye” and the motion carried.

Re-appointment – Belinda Nichols and Steve Collins to the Historic District Commission to expire June 30, 2019 – Mayor Hardesty

Mayor Hardesty recommended Belinda Nichols and Steve Collins be re-appointed to the Historic District Commission to expire June 30, 2019.

Councilmember Page moved to approve the appointments. Seconded by Councilmember Swindler.

All voted “aye” and the motion carried.

Re-appointments – Jay Dholakia and Vance Riester (Joint Appointment) to the Tourism Commission Term to Expire June 20, 2019 – Mayor Hardesty

Mayor Hardesty recommended Jay Dholakia and Vance Riester (joint appointment) be re-appointed to the Tourism Commission terms to expire on June 30, 2016.

Councilmember Suttor moved to approve the re-appointments. Seconded by Councilmember Swindler.

All voted “aye” and the motion carried.

Public Comments

Bob Perkins with the Kentucky Changers addressed the council asking for funds on behalf of his organization. He is associated with the Kentucky Baptist Convention. They will bring young workers in between the 7th to 12th grade to work on homes in Shelby County. These young adults will stay in one of the local schools. They hope to complete 8-12 projects while in the area. They are asking \$7000 from the city.

Department Reports

Jennifer Herrell, Public Works Superintendent/Engineer, report in packet. She was informed by Councilmember Eaton that the railroad crossing on Smithfield Road is rough. Councilmember Eaton said she had been getting calls about the crossing.

Eilene Collins, Executive Director, Shelby Main Street, reported there were two winners in the plant container contest. The award is ice cream cakes.

Doug Herndon, Assistant Fire Chief, reported the department contained a house fire at 71 Juniper Street. The Crusade for Children is this weekend and this will be the first year of no roadblocks in the city. We are going door to door in the city neighborhoods and we will be set up at Kroger.

Mayor’s Report

Mayor Hardesty reported City Hall is changing out phones. Please be patient if you can’t reach anyone. The water tower is going up on Prospect.

Council Reports

Councilmember Andriot reported the Restaurant Committee has had 3 meetings. Good ideas have been received. He thinks citizens will be pleased.
