Minutes/Special Called Meeting August 11, 2016

Councilmember Page moved to approve the minutes of the special called meeting of August 11, 2016 as read by councilmembers prior to the meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Suttor.

All voted “aye”, and the motion carried.

Presentation Request – Hollie Spade, AT&T Kentucky

Hollie Spade with AT&T Kentucky addressed the council to announce the Industrial Park on Midland Trail is fiber ready. This designation means businesses and tenants have high speed, reliable and secure internet connectivity.

Ordinance No. 2016-08-18/An Ordinance Levying Ad Valorem Property Taxes for the Calendar Year 2016 – 2nd Reading – Inez Harris, City Clerk

Inez Harris, City Clerk, read an ordinance of the City of Shelbyville levying the ad valorem property taxes for the calendar year 2016. The rate on real property has been assessed at 27.2 cents on each hundred dollars and the rate on personal property has been assessed at 33.5 cents on each 100 dollars.

Councilmember Eaton moved to approve for a second reading. Seconded by Councilmember Zoeller.

Ordinance No. 2016-08-18(A)/An Amendment to an Ordinance Adopting the City of Shelbyville Annual Budget for the Calendar Year July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016 – 2nd Reading- Inez Harris, City Clerk

Inez Harris, City Clerk, read an amendment of the City of Shelbyville estimating revenues and resources, and appropriating funds for the operation of the City of Shelbyville for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

It was introduced for a second reading by Councilmember Suttor. Seconded by Councilmember Zoeller.

Upon roll call, the following voted “aye”: Page, Swindler, Suttor, Eaton, Zoeller and Andriot.

Department Reports

Jennifer Herrell, Public Works Superintendent/Engineer, reported the 2016 Street Paving Bid is out. The budget for this year is \$150,000. The following street will be paved: Allen Drive, Mareli, Mt. Vernon

Drive, North 2nd Street, and part of Charleston Way. She is hoping to get part of Third Street under the train trestle done as well.

Fred Rogers, City Administrator, is juggling this position and the Historic District at this time. He's hoping to fill the Historic District Assistant position soon.

Mayor's Report

Mayor Hardesty reported a concert will be held on August 20th. The band "Juice Box Heroes" will perform. There will be a concert on 6th Street on August 27th. Rut and Strut produced their first barrel of bourbon.

Council Reports

Councilmember Eaton would like to see the \$5.00 per day yard sales be reduced to \$5.00 per two days. After much discussion, Mr. Gregory will change the ordinance to \$5.00 for 2 consecutive days or \$5.00 for a 72 hour period.

Councilmember Swindler moved to adjourn at 6:55 PM. Seconded by Councilmember Page.
