

Council Meeting – September 1, 2016

Mayor Tom Hardesty called the regular council meeting to order with these councilmembers present: Bobby Andriot, Donna Eaton, Jon Swindler and Frank Page. Absent: Mike Zoeller, Shane Suttor.

City employees present: Inez Harris, Jennifer Herrell, Fred Rogers, Candice Selph, Kevin Baker and D. Sasser.

City Attorney: Steven Gregory

All present pledged allegiance to the flag.

Minutes – August 18, 2016

Councilmember Swindler moved to approve the minutes of August 18, 2016 as read by councilmembers prior to the meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Page.

All voted “aye” and the motion carried.

Ordinance/An Ordinance Amending Chapter 60 of the City of Shelbyville Code of Ordinances Relating to Regulatory Licenses for Yard Sales – 1st Reading, Steven Gregory

Steven Gregory, City Attorney, read an ordinance of the City of Shelbyville amending Chapter 60 relating to yard sales where the fee has been changed to \$5.00 for a period no more than three consecutive days.

It was introduced for first reading by Councilmember Eaton. Seconded by Councilmember Swindler.

Approval of Bids for Street Paving – Jennifer Herrell

Jennifer Herrell, Superintendent Public Works, recommended Flynn Brothers Construction for the 2016 Street Resurfacing Project. They were the lowest bid at \$121,534.60. They also paved for the city in 2009 and 2012. The budget for this year’s pavement is \$150,000.

Councilmember Page moved to approve the recommendation. Seconded by Councilmember Eaton.

Approval of Bids for Selling Surplus Fire Apparatus – Fire Chief Kevin Baker

Fire Chief Kevin Baker reported two bids were received for the surplus apparatus. They are for a 1998 KME Mini Pumper firefighting apparatus for \$10,511.99 and for a 1989 GMC Rescue Truck for \$13,001.

Councilmember Swindler moved to accept the bids. Seconded by Councilmember Eaton.

All voted “aye” and the motion carried.

Public Comments

Mrs. Stacie Rockaway addressed the council on behalf of Congressman Massie. She is available for help with grant applications, military academy and to help with any projects we may have trouble with.

Department Reports

Jennifer Herrell, City Engineer/Public Works, reported the Household Hazardous Waste event will be October 1st from 9AM to 2 PM in the old Winn Dixie parking lot. Brandan Nutter has been hired to replace Jessie Price as the Public Works mechanic. His first day is September 6th.

Candice Selph, HR Director, reported Brandan Nutter at Public Works and Cheryl Rose at the Welcome Center are our newest employees. The Employee Picnic will be held at Red Orchard on Thursday, September 29.

Fire Chief Kevin Baker reported the new recruit class is coming along. First Baptist Church is honoring our local first responders on September 10th. The new burn container is 99% complete. The first test is next Tuesday. The department is hosting a chili supper on October 22, 2016 at 6 PM to meet and greet local candidates running for office. The proceeds will go to the Crusade for Children. We are currently inspecting apartment buildings.

Steve Gregory, City Attorney, reported the Telecommunications Committee is still reviewing the applications. They have asked for more information. This is a non-exclusive franchise and all 3 bids could be awarded.

Mayor's Report

Mayor Hardesty reminded everyone that Taste and Tunes is on September 8, 2016. City offices will be closed in observance of Labor Day. Governor Bevin is scheduled to make and appearance at Roll Forming promoting "Work to Learn".
