

Special Called Meeting – September 22, 2016

Mayor Thomas L. Hardesty called the special called meeting to order with the following council members present: Bobby Andriot, Mike Zoeller, Jon Swindler, and Frank Page. Absent: Donna Eaton and Shane Suttor.

City employees present: Danny Goodwin, Kevin Baker, Jennifer Herrell, Inez Harris and Fred Rogers.

City Attorney: Steven Gregory.

Invocation: Dr. Jeffrey McGillen, Adult Pastor, First Baptist Church

All present pledged allegiance to the flag.

Minutes – September 1, 2016

Councilmember Swindler moved to approve the minutes of the September 1, 2016 council meeting as read by council members prior to the netting. Seconded by Councilmember Page.

All voted “aye” and the motion carried.

Ordinance No. 2016-09-22/An Ordinance Amending Chapter 60 of the City of Shelbyville Code of Ordinances Relating to Regulatory Licenses for Yard Sales – 2nd Reading, Steven Gregory

Steven Gregory, City Attorney, read the summary of an ordinance of the City of Shelbyville amending Chapter 60 relating to yard sales changing the five dollars for a period lasting no more than three (3) consecutive days. The limit is still two (2) yard sales per year at any one (1) location and a limit of two (2) yard sale permits per year issued to any one (1) person.

Councilmember Swindler introduced for second reading. Seconded by Councilmember Page.

Upon roll call, the following councilmembers voted “aye”: Andriot, Zoeller, Swindler, and Page. Absent: Eaton and Suttor.

Ordinance/An Ordinance Enacting and Adopting a Supplement to the Code of ordinances of the City of Shelbyville – 1st Reading, Steven Gregory

Steven Gregory, City Attorney, read an ordinance of the City of Shelbyville adopting the 2016-S19 Supplement to the Code of Ordinances as submitted by American Legal Publishing Corporation.

It was introduced by Councilmember Zoeller. Seconded by Councilmember Andriot.

Ordinance/An Ordinance Levying Annual Assessment of the Clear Creek Subdivision Public Improvement Bonds – 1st Reading, Steven Gregory

Steven Gregory, City Attorney, read an ordinance levying the 2017 annual assessment for the Clear Creek Subdivision Public Improvement Bond. The total amount to be collected is \$79,972.88. The amount levied on a pro rata basis for each lot is \$1,508.92.

It was introduced for first reading by Councilmember Swindler. Seconded by Councilmember Page.

Re-appointment – Wayne Long to the Triple S Zoning Board of Adjustments & Appeals –
Mayor Hardesty

Mayor Hardesty recommended Wayne Long be re-appointed to the Triple S Board of Adjustments and Appeals to a term to expire October 1, 2020.

Councilmember Zoeller moved to approve the appointment. Seconded by Councilmember Swindler.

All voted “aye” and the motion carried.

Department Reports

Jennifer Herrell, Public Works Superintendent, reminded everyone of the Hazardous Waste Event on October 1, 2016. The time is 9-2 pm at the Midland Shopping Center. The 2016 paving will start in mid-October. Public Works is working on storm box repairs before paving starts. The City purchased the house and barn adjacent to Public Works. Both have been demolished, and we are clearing up the property at this time.

Eileen Collins, Executive Director, Shelby Main, thanked public works for installing bike bollards designed by Steve Meador. The annual board meeting is October 10, 2016 at Andriot’s Paint on Main Street. The time is 5:30 pm. Awards will be given out at that time.

Inez Harris, City Clerk/Treasurer, reported 2016 property tax bills will go out on Friday, September 23rd.

Police Chief Danny Goodwin reported his department has had a busy summer. They set up a block watch in Town and County. There is a drug drop box available at the Police Department anytime. Thanks to First Baptist Church for their support. We received a \$34,000 grant from Homeland Security for cameras and an \$8,000 grant for federal overtime. For the month of August we received 1,342 calls for service.

Fire Chief Kevin Baker reported the department is hosting a “Meet the Candidate” chili/bean soup supper on October 22, 2016. The proceeds go to the Crusade for Children. It will be held at Station 2. The radio system connecting all the Fire Stations in the county will go digital on October 3, 2016. Thanks to First Baptist Church for the first responders meal.

Fred Rogers, City Administrator, reported Cheryl Rose has been hired for the part-time position at the Historic District. The matching fund program is ready to go. Award letters will go out next week. Blue Gables is ready for tenants. There is a mural going up on Washington Street.

Mayor's Report

Mayor Hardesty reported the Employee's Banquet will be held on September 29th at Red Orchard Park. There will be a Lineman's Rodeo held on September 29th and 30th at the Shelby County Fairgrounds. There will be a Sixth Street Concert this Saturday. The KLC conference will be held October 4-7th. There will not be a council meeting on October 7th, but a special called meeting on October 13th.

Councilmember Page moved to adjourn at 7:07 pm. Seconded by Councilmember Swindler.
