### **Minutes/September 22, 2016**

Councilmember Page moved to approve the minutes of the September 22, 2016 meeting as read by council members prior to the meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Zoeller.

### **Ordinance No. 2016-10-13 – Enacting and Adopting a Supplement to the Code of Ordinances of the City of Shelbyville – 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading, Steven Gregory**

Steven Gregory, City Attorney, read an ordinance of the City of Shelbyville, whereas; American Legal Publishing has completed the 2016 S-19 Supplement to the Code of Ordinances of the City of Shelbyville.

### **Ordinance No. 2016-10-13(A) - An Ordinance Levying Annual Assessment for the Clear Creek Subdivision Public Improvement Bonds – 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading, Steve Gregory**

Steven Gregory, City Attorney, read an ordinance of the City of Shelbyville levying the annual assessment for the Clear Creek Subdivision. The amount to be collected for 2017 is \$1508.92 per lot.

### **Department Reports**

Jennifer Herrell, Public Works Engineer, reported the Household Hazardous Waste event was October 1<sup>st</sup>. There were 326 participants. Street paving is scheduled for the last week in October. Leaf pickup has started and will run until January. They are busy working on

Celebration of Lights. An application for the KLCIS Liability Safety Grant for the 2016-2017 year has been submitted.

Eilene Collins, Executive Director, Shelby Main Street, reported working on vendor placement and entertainment for Celebration of Lights. At the annual meeting on Monday, four new members were voted in. She will be attending the fall state meeting on Main Street with the Kentucky Heritage Council. They will be sleeping at Pine Mountain State Park, and visiting different cities in that area.

### **Mayor's Report**

Mayor Hardesty reported Halloween is between the hours of 5-7 pm on October 31, 2016. Shoppes of the Bluegrass will hold an open house on October 18, 2016 starting at 5 pm. The city fire department is hosting a chili supper at Station 2. This is also a chance to meet candidates in this year's election.

### **Council Reports**

Councilmember Zoeller reported the restaurant tax will pay for murals to be up by Celebration of Lights. We also replaced some pavers and ordered new banners. The 911 building has been painted. Public Works will get the benches and trash cans painted. October 27<sup>th</sup> there will be a meeting on the Multi-use Pathways at 6:30 pm here at City Hall. There will be a 5 minute presentation.

Councilmember Page reported he along with David Eaton of Simpsonville spoke to 11<sup>th</sup> graders on the Restaurant Tax. Eighty percent were in favor of the tax once they understood the pros and cons of the tax.

Councilmember Zoeller moved to adjourn the meeting at 7:05 pm. Seconded by Councilmember Suttor. All voted by saying "aye" and the motion carried.
